Wyoming Unemployment Insurance Claims Report, April 2021

Initial Claims Down 71.7% from Prior Year

April 2021 marked the second consecutive month of over-the-year decline in initial Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims in Wyoming, as the state continues to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic that began in March 2020. April also marked the first over-the-year decline in continued claims since the start of the pandemic.

Initial Claims

Wyoming had 5,806 *initial claims* (see Definitions, page 9) in April 2021, down from a record 20,485 in April 2020 (-14,679, or -71.7%). Initial claims peaked in April 2020 and have largely trended downward since. See Figure 1.

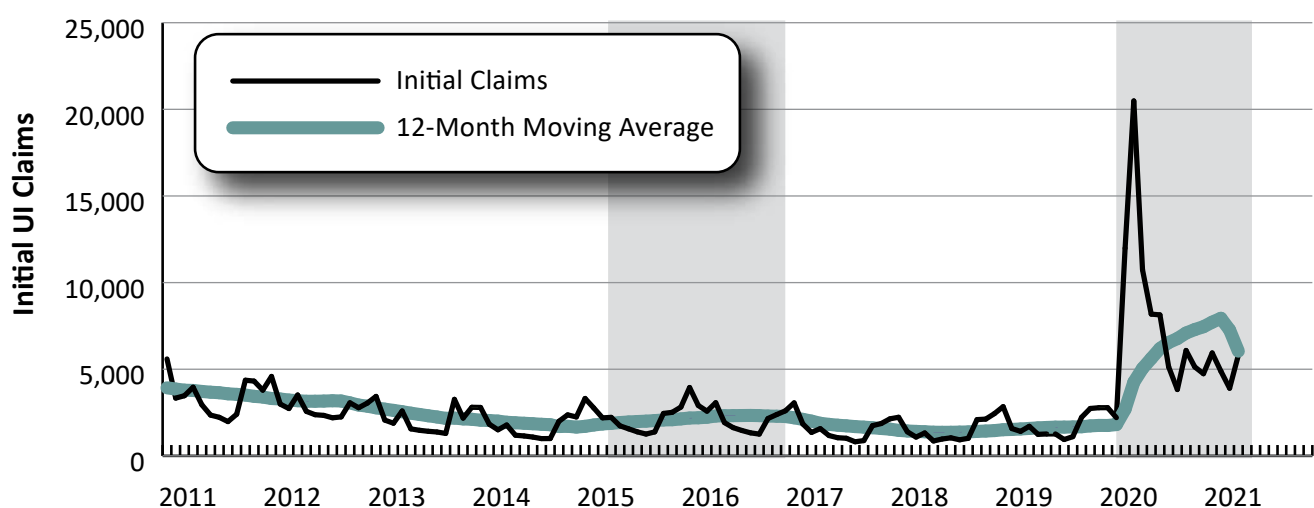
The number of claims declined from

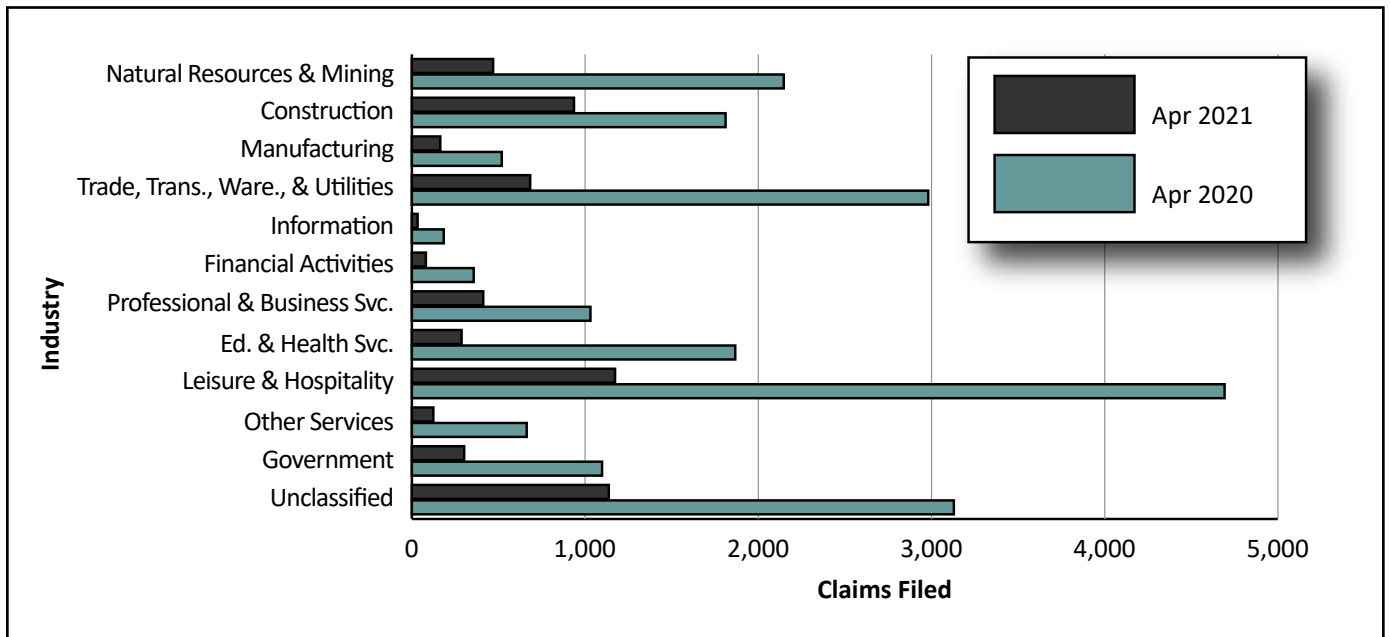


Figure 3: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, April 2020 and April 2021

the prior year in all industries, led by leisure & hospitality (-3,519, or -75.0%), unclassified (-1,992, or -63.7%), natural resources & mining (-1,678, or -78.2%), education & health services (-1,580, or -84.6%), and retail trade (-1,254, or -79.5%). See Table 1 (page 5) and Figure 3 (page 6).

Initial claims also decreased from prior-year levels in all counties, including Natrona (-2,734, or -74.0%), Laramie

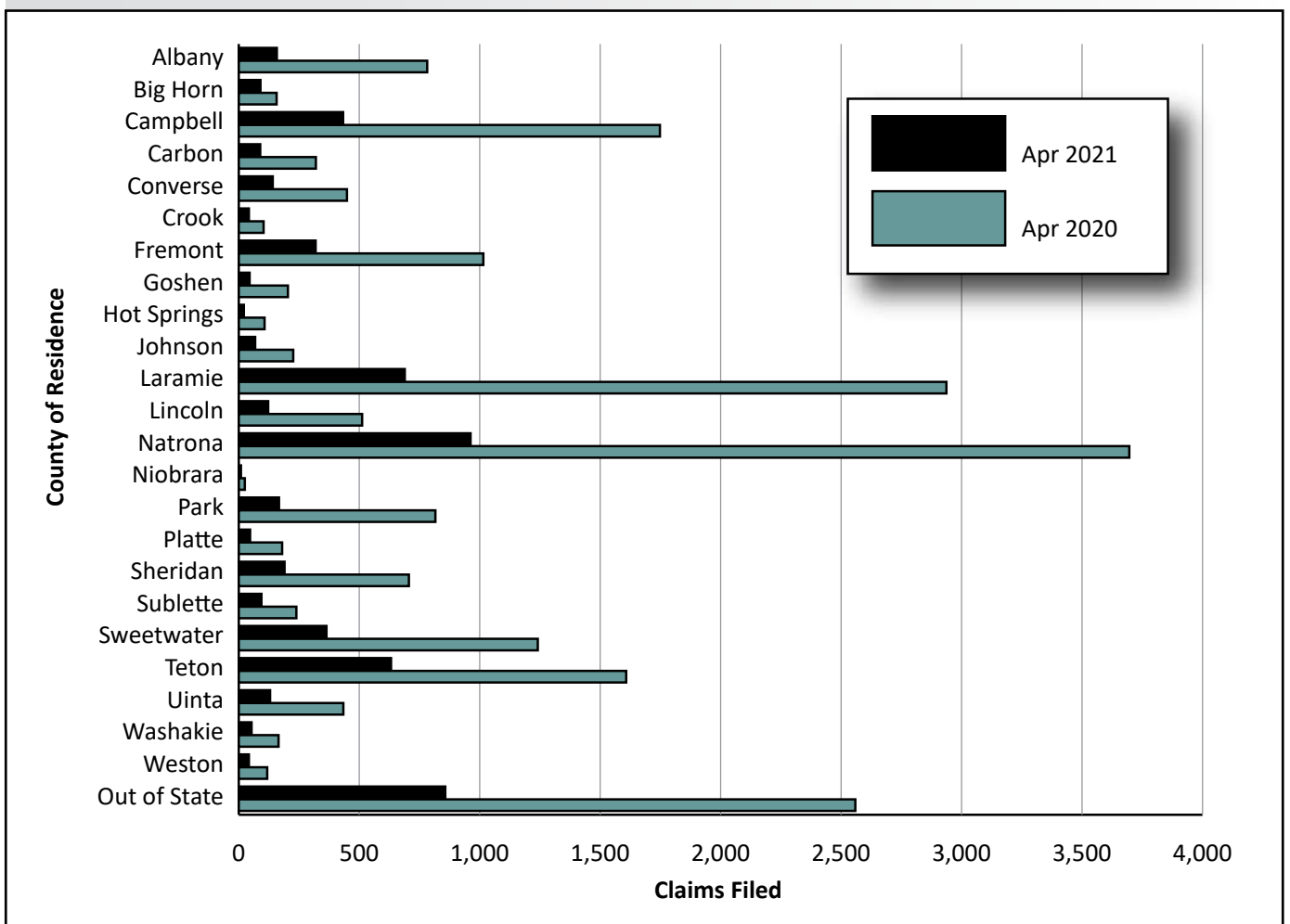


Figure 4: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, April 2020 and April 2021

(-2,248, or -76.5%), Campbell (-1,315, or -75.2%), and Teton (-976, or -60.7%) counties. The number of out-of-state claimants decreased by 1,702 (-66.5%). See Figure 4 (page 6) and Table 3 (page 9).

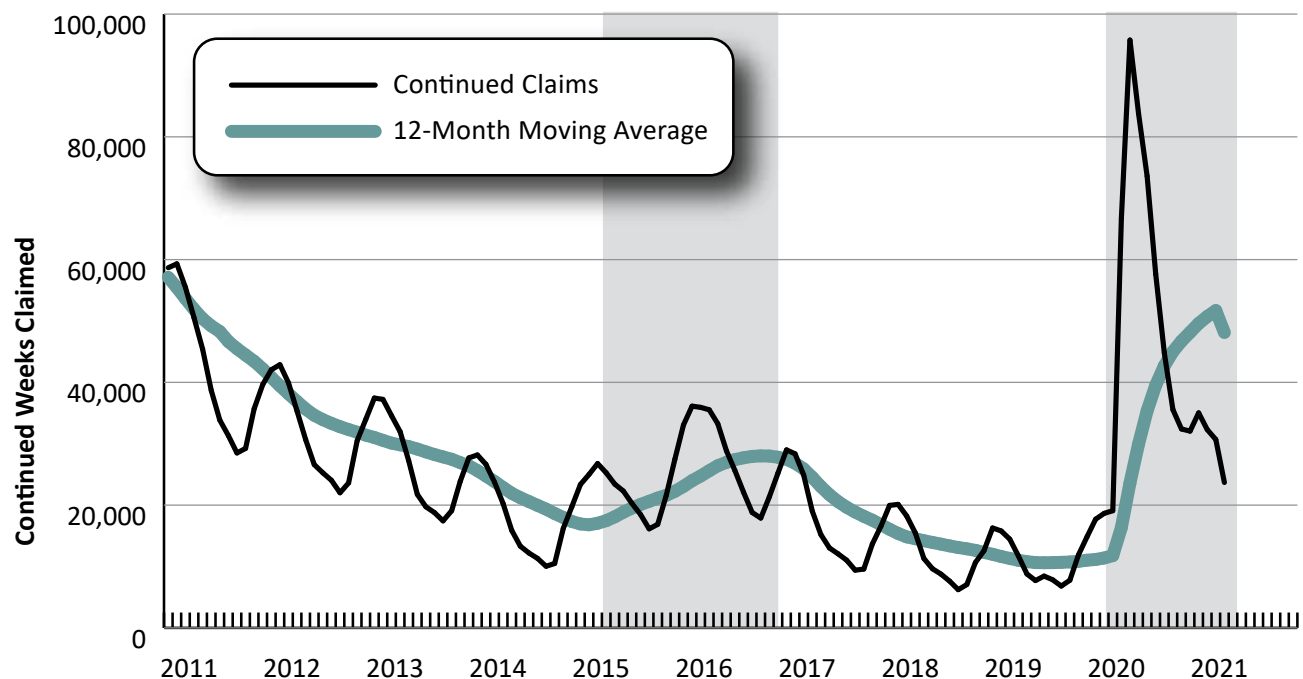
Continued Claims

The total number of *continued weeks claimed* (see Definitions, page 9) decreased from 66,694 in April 2020 to 23,687 in April 2021 (-43,007, or -64.4%). The number of unique claimants decreased from 19,215 to 7,958 (-11,257, or -58.6%). See Figure 2 and Table 2, page 7.

Continued claims declined in all industries over the year, with the greatest

decreases seen in leisure & hospitality (-15,164, or -82.5%), natural resources & mining (-4,567, or -74.1%), education & health services (-4,513, or -79.3%), unclassified (-3,473, or -43.0%), and construction (-3,173, or -38.7%).

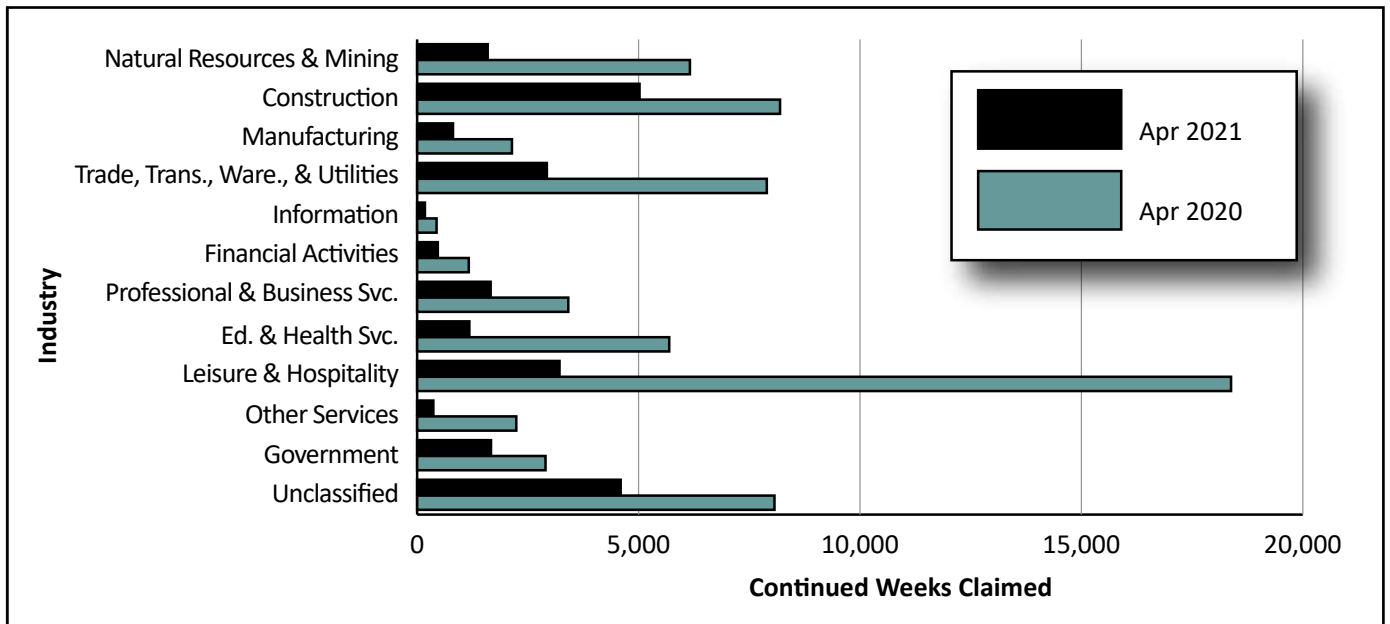


Figure 5: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, April 2020 and April 2021

Continued claims fell in nearly every county over the year, with the greatest decreases seen in Natrona (-7,296, or -64.1%), Laramie (-5,839, or -67.1%), Teton (-5,055, or -79.5%), and Campbell (-3,233, or -65.1%) counties. The number of total weeks claimed by out-of-state recipients decreased by 5,227 (-59.1%). Continued claims remained unchanged in Niobrara County. See Table 2, page 7, and Figure 5, page 8.

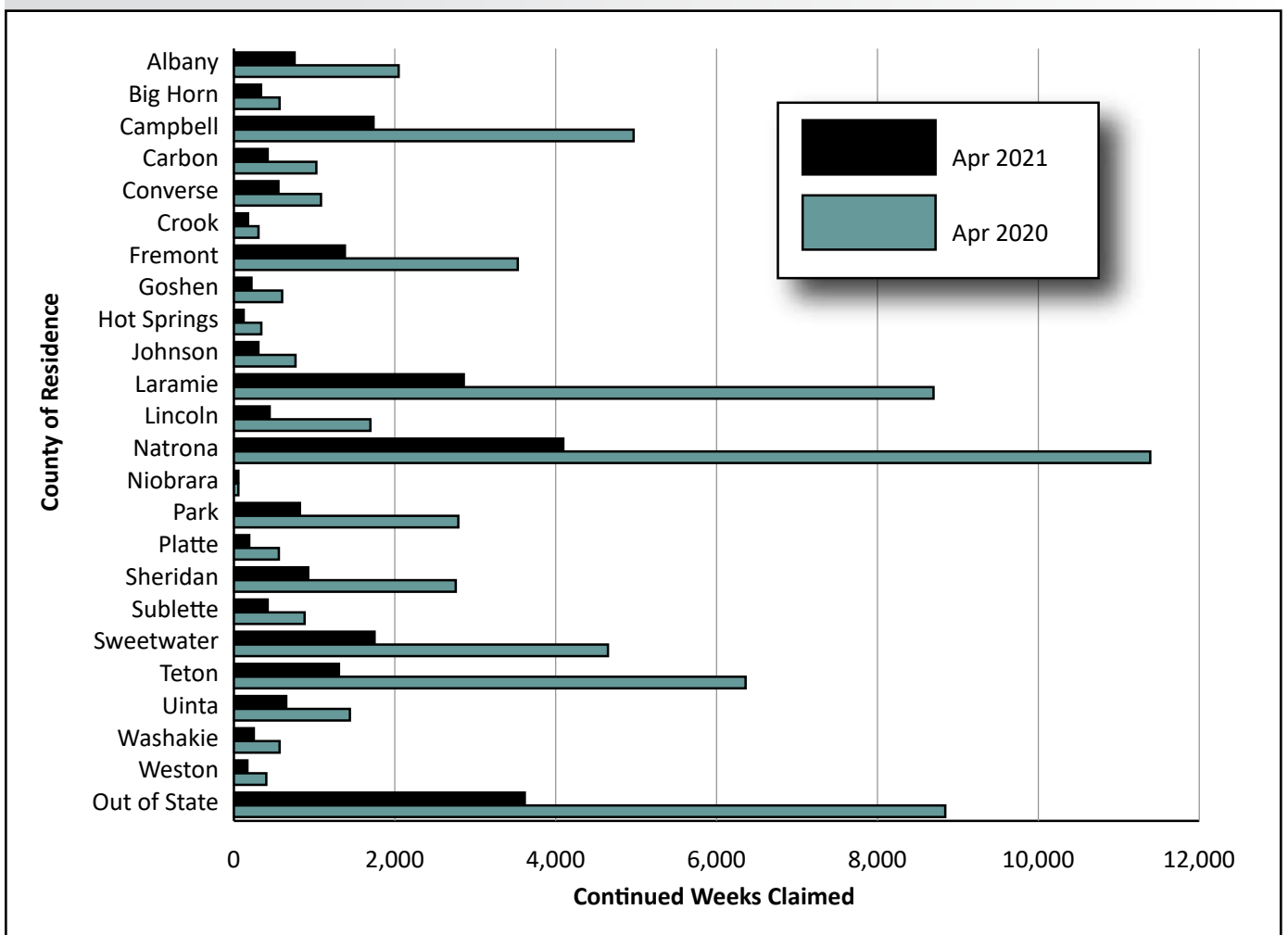


Figure 6: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence in Wyoming, April 2020 and April 2021

Box: Definitions

Initial Claim: An initial claim is filed by an unemployed individual after a separation from an employer. The claim requests a determination of basic eligibility for the Unemployment Insurance benefits.

Continued Weeks Claimed: The number of weeks of UI benefits claimed during the reference period. An unemployed individual who has already filed an initial claim and who has experienced a week of unemployment and then filed a continued claim to claim benefits for that week of unemployment.
